



Inside the Mind of Favela Funk

Inside the Mind of Favela Funk is a documentary about love and relationships in the world of the extremely popular 'favela funk': pornographic music from Rio de Janeiro's deprived neighborhoods.

Set in Rio de Janeiro's most notorious favelas, the underprivileged youth share their perspective on the extremely popular, pornographic favela funk music with respect to their personal (love) lives, situated in a lawless subculture of drug gangs, machismo, violence and sex. 'Inside the Mind of Favela Funk' is a documentary about love and relationships in the world of the extremely popular 'favela funk': pornographic music from Rio de Janeiro's deprived neighborhoods. The documentary shows the perspective of the favela youth and aims to find the relation between the favela funk lyrics and their personal, daily (love) lives, dominated by a lawless subculture of drug gangs, violence and sex. 'Inside the Mind of Favela Funk' gives an insight in the current Brazilian underground music and its corresponding sexual values, but it also shows a search for faith, hope and love.

Those who listen to favela funk without knowing Portuguese mainly hear swinging music. But those who do know it hear - especially in the 'putaria' variety - explicit, misogynistic lyrics about sex. This male-dominated style enjoys a huge popularity in the slums of Rio de Janeiro. But why?

What do these downright pornographic lyrics say about male-female relations? And what does this musical trend mean for love and relationships in these neighbourhoods?

The filmmakers interviewed the (both male and female) artists as well as young boys and girls about the controversial putaria funk. Their open-hearted answers shed light on their relationships and reveal a lot about these underprivileged districts, where people grow up in poverty, surrounded by drug-related violence and death. In between the interviews, the camera films the typical narrow alleyways and dark living quarters that add visual emphasis to the stories the young people tell about their tough lives.

"We made the choice to only show the perspective of the favela youth, and not involve outside experts or text cards. 

They Will Have to Kill Us First

In 2012, three extremist groups captured most of the north Mali – an area the size of the UK and France combined. The cities were virtually shut down, sharia law was instituted and all music was banned.

Music is the beating heart of Malian culture. But when Islamic hardliners took control of northern Mali, they enforced one of the harshest interpretations of sharia law in history and, crucially for Mali, they banned all forms of music. Radio stations were destroyed, instruments burned and Mali's musicians faced torture, even death. Overnight, Mali's revered musicians were forced into hiding or exile where most remain even now. But rather than lay down their instruments, the musicians are fighting back, standing up for their cultural heritage and identity. Through everything, they have used music as their weapon against the on-going violence that has left Mali ravaged. The stories of these artists are told without gloss - they are sometimes heartbreaking, sometimes inspirational, and sometimes incredibly frustrating as we watch musicians make tough choices about their futures.

Upstream Color

'The most visually imaginative American film since David Lynch's Eraserhead' (Time Out), 'Upstream Color' might be described as an oblique romantic science-fiction mystery thriller.

A woman, Kris, is kidnapped by a drug manufacturer (Thief) and contaminated with a worm that keeps her in a trance-like state during which the Thief strips her of all her savings. Kris is subsequently dewormed by a character known as the Sampler, who transfers the parasite into a pig that maintains a physical and/or metaphorical connection to Kris. Kris later meets and falls in love with Jeff who, we eventually discover, has been a victim of the same ordeal.

The rest of story resists synopsis, and even the bits that can be summarized probably shouldn't be, because "Upstream Color" can't be reduced to a linear narrative. It's not about what does or does not happen to whom and when. It is what it is, as it is, in any given moment.

Anyway, critics consensus is: As technically brilliant as it is narratively abstract, Upstream Color represents experimental American cinema at its finest - and reaffirms Shane Carruth as a talent to watch.




